Registration:

Units are requested to pre register. Troop 357 is providing staves for one of the events and needs to know how many patrols will be participating.

For pre-registration, units are requested to indicate the anticipated number of Scouts, patrols, and Scouters attending the event. A 50% deposit is required at that time with the balance due at the event. This will prevent any unit from overpayment due to changes in levels of participation.

Registration fee includes Streamer for your unit flag and patches for this event.

A class 1 or 3 medical form is required for everyone attending this event. ***All medical forms will be collected at registration.*** All med forms ***must*** be maintained at HQ during the event. All forms will be returned at check out with your unit's patches on Sunday morning.

Directions: Take Route 16 (the Spaulding Tpk.) to Exit 17.

Go 3/4 mile East on Route 75, then 3 1/4 miles North on Route 125, through the town of Milton and past Ray's Marina.

Watch for the Mi-Te-Jo Campground sign on the right. Turn right onto Townhouse Road.

The entrance to Mi-Te-Jo Campground will be 1 mile on your left, on Mi-Te-Jo Road.

Fires/Cooking: Cooking fires/campfires will be allowed only in existing fire pits at campsites and at the discretion of the property owner.

Proper fire precautions must be followed at all times!

Equipment List

Each Patrol should be equipped with the following equipment:

- **Scout Spirit**
- **Patrol flag**
- **Compass**
- **tarp**
- **Patrol first aid kit**
- **Scout hand book**
- **Flint & steel, steel wool & 9 volt battery, or friction bow**
- **Fire wood, tinder and kindling for small cooking fire**
- **Pencil or pen and paper**
- **Two skits and a song**
- **100' of 1/4" rope, may be in multiple pieces**
- **(4) 4-5' wooden planks, optional**
- **(6) 4' staves**
- **(8) 6' staves**
- **Rake – Several per unit – this is for a service project for our host for this event.**
